Master Blasters (boys and girls aged 7 to 10)

Junior Blasters is for those players that are developing skills required to play cricket. Depending on age and ability, players normally have two years in this program before progressing to Master Blasters. HIGHWAY HEROES

In Highway Heroes for Term 4, Years 1-3 students are focusing on Strategies 4 Managing Me, looking at the emotional highway and resilience. Years 4-6 are focusing on Connecting 4 Friendships, beginning to talk about friendliness and The Friendliness SPICE.

YEARS 1-3:

As children travel through life, a very important part of being able to cope with social, emotional and learning issues is resilience. Resilience is a part of being able to bounce back from adversity. In teaching children how to be resilient, we are helping them to develop the skills to cope with difficulties. A very important part of helping children to develop their resilience is teaching them how to monitor and manage their emotions and feelings. Resilience is built on a foundation of maturing emotional awareness. By acknowledging a child's emotions, talking about these and bringing awareness to these, children develop their ability to self-regulate—the essence of resilience.

YEARS 4-6:

Most children will say the best part of coming to school is being with their friends. Last fortnight's lesson is all about learning the skills to make and keep friends, join in on games and respond to some of the difficulties that can occur along the way. Friendliness is a set of behaviours that are easily recognised and can be acquired by anyone with motivation and patience. Students have been introduced to The Friendliness SPICE, a handy and memorable acronym for a 'friendliness package'. The Friendliness SPICE highlights friendly behaviours and encourages students to Smile and Say hello, Praise, Invite, Chat and Enjoy. Through role-play, students have been practising these skills.

Year 3 - Room B Indonesian Batik

The students in our class have been learning about Indonesia and the traditional way they make batik. Then we made our own batik.

In Indonesia they would make a pattern on material and then trace over it with hot wax before dying the cloth. We used a flour paste instead of wax.

In Indonesia, hand-made batik is very expensive as it is very hard to make and can take months to produce a piece of fabric. It takes a lot of practice and skill.

Our finished products are bagus sekali!
